

Singapore - Hong Kong - Chicago - Tampa




#### But, saved a day!

 USF Park: A park maintained by the University of South Florida, the main local organizers of the conference




#### Tampa Convention Center

  - Excellent facilities




#### Tampa Convention Center

 Prof. Anil K. Jain (Michigan State University) won KS Fu Prize (sort of lifetime achievement award in the field of data mining)






# My Poster at ICPR 2008


